How to Apply for Service:

- ❖ Download and print the GLASS service application from the GLASS website at www.georgialibraries.org/glass.
- ❖ Complete the application.
- ❖ Have the application signed by a certifying authority. Refer to the application to learn who qualifies as a certifying authority. If the reader has a visual or physical disability, a librarian may sign as the certifying authority. Only a medical doctor or a doctor of osteopathy qualifies as the certifying authority for a person who has a reading disability. A family member may not sign as the certifying authority.
