Eligible applicants

Nursing homes, hospitals, schools for the blind, public and private schools, and college university disability centers may borrow equipment and reading materials for use by eligible patrons in either a group setting or for individual use.

The institution is responsible for keeping a record of the serial numbers of all machines assigned to the institution. Eligible residents, not the institution, are responsible for equipment borrowed directly using individual applications.

Public or private schools and college university centers where students with disabilities are enrolled are encouraged to have each student submit the Application for Individuals but may use this form accompanied by certification of eligibility for each applicant.

For music materials, e.g., scores, instructional recordings, and music magazines, the individual application must be submitted.

Eligibility for issue of library materials

1. The following persons are eligible for loan service:
 - a. Blind persons whose visual acuity, as determined by competent authority, is 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses, or whose widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees.
 - b. Other physically disabled persons as follows:
 - i. Persons whose visual disability, with correction and regardless of optical measurement, is certified by competent authority as preventing the reading of regular printed materials.
 - ii. Persons certified by competent authority as unable to read or unable to use regular printed material as a result of physical limitations.
 - iii. Persons certified by competent authority as having a reading disability resulting from organic dysfunction and of sufficient severity to prevent their reading regular printed material in a normal manner.
2. In cases of blindness, visual disability, or physical limitation, the administrator of the institution may serve as the certifying authority.
 3. In the case of reading disability from organic dysfunction, competent authority is defined as doctors of medicine and doctors of osteopathy who may consult with colleagues in associated disciplines.
 4. Eligible readers must be residents of the United States, including the several states, territories, insular possessions, and the District of Columbia, or American citizens domiciled abroad.

Lending of Materials and Classes of Borrowers

Veterans - In the lending of books, recordings, playback equipment, musical scores, instructional texts, and other specialized materials, preference shall be given at all times to the needs of qualified persons who have been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States.

Institutions - Institutions such as schools, residential care facilities, hospitals, and other establishments regularly attended by individuals who are unable to read standard print due to a disability may borrow special format reading materials and playback equipment solely for the use of persons certified as eligible, who must be the direct and only recipients of the materials and equipment provided by NLS.
